OUTGOING PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

NOVEMBER 18, 2017

It has been my pleasure to represent CSHP Ontario Branch as President over the past year.

In review of the last two years I have been a part of the Executive, I find myself drawing comparisons to our work to that of building a house.

In my first year as president elect, a key council activity was the development of our blueprint - - the CSHP Ontario Branch Strategic Plan - - and since that blueprint was approved in November 2016 we have focused on ensuring all activities of council were in alignment and focused on achieving our objectives. Unlike some strategic plans, we have not allowed our document to simply sit on a shelf – it has become the focal point of both executive and council meetings and performance to our plan is monitored on a continual basis.

I would like to take a few minutes to share with you further information on the strategic plan and provide you with updates on activities to date. To recap - - our plan was created to align with the CSHP National plan - - there are four pillars within the plan – pharmacists’ practice, member and volunteer engagement, governance and organizational effectiveness.

Under Pharmacists’ practice, as a Branch

we are looking to align and support the CSHP Excellence in Hospital Pharmacy Program and I would ask that you review this program on the CSHP website and consider completing your declaration of commitment to the program – we also continue to focus on creating educational opportunities for members and recognition of members through our awards program. Of note, we have achieved increased attendance with record numbers at both our Hospital Pharmacy Management Seminar and the event today, the Education Sessions. We also continue to provide Aseptic Compounding education in the attempts to assist our members meet sterile compounding standards and recognize members through our Awards Event which will happen later today.

In addition, we are continually advocating for CSHP Members.

In the past 6 months we have authored eight communications on topics as varied as congratulatory letters to key stakeholders and new Directors of Pharmacy to consulting with the Ontario College of Pharmacists on hospital assessment criteria to responding to the Opioid Crisis and recent news articles on this issue. Each of these communications is available to members on the CSHP Ontario Branch website.

We also continue to work with key stakeholders to advance our initiatives such as promoting pharmacists to work to full scope of practice in hospitals and collaborative settings and advocating for pharmacist prescribing, working to combat the opioid crisis, and to ensure hospital assessment by OCP enhances patient outcomes.

Our next pillar is Member and Volunteer Engagement – in this area we have revitalized the publication of the Hospital Pharmacy in Ontario, better known as HPO, and are working hard to understand what our member’s value in CSHP and use this information to retain and attract new members.

On the governance front, we have been reviewing and renewing branch documents and have just launched the start of annual council surveys as well as surveys of outgoing council members to ensure we learn from experience and apply these learnings as we move forward.

Under our last pillar, organizational effectiveness, we have continued our path of making investments to provide member

benefits – whether it is investing in our pharmacist prescribing initiative, aseptic compounding course or development of a new website, we are using our funds to further our strategic objectives. These investments are possible due to a healthy reserve along with consecutive successful education events.

We also are striving to have an effective council structure, recently adding a number of co-chair roles with succession planning and engaged council members as key outcomes. Finally, we are looking to enhance our communications to members – and recognize the need to share the great work being done.

As you can tell, we have been very busy following our blueprint and working to construct the house that is CSHP Ontario Branch.

Before concluding my report I would like to take some time to say thank you and provide my view on the focus for the next year and possibly years to follow.

First some thanks – A big thank you to all of my colleagues on council and in particular those serving on the executive - - thank you Sam Dhaliwall for your work – we will miss you at the executive table however, know that your involvement in council will continue through your role as primary care co-chair.

Thanks go to Christine Truong, a long serving council member who is completing her term as Treasurer where she has done an admirable job leading us from a financial perspective.

A big welcome to Olavo Fernandes as incoming Treasurer and Deb Merrill our incoming president elect – I look forward to working with both of you in your new roles.

Also thanks go to Anne Stacey - - you have been instrumental in moving us forward with our plan – thank you for consistent, excellent work and ongoing efforts to keep executive and council organized and on track.

Finally, thanks and best wishes to our ‘soon to be’ president Katie Hollis – I know CSHP Ontario Branch is in good hands and will continue to thrive under your leadership.

So where do I see us going in the next year?

Membership and Communication.

We have worked hard to bring value to CSHP members – we now need to ensure we communicate this work - - this is an area that we have not performed well over the past several years - - our members

need to understand the value their membership brings and an important starting point for this understanding is to ensure communication to members occurs in a variety of formats, methods and approaches.

We also need to focus on membership – Ontario has a significant portion of pharmacists working in hospitals and collaborative care settings that are not CSHP Members - - After completing some research, we now believe we understand what members value - - now is the time to deliver – not only to retain current members but to attract new pharmacists to our organization.

Now that we have built the house, let’s ensure we fill it with like-minded colleagues – it is time for us to grow and ensure hospital pharmacists in Ontario are well represented as they continue to provide excellent patient care.
