Evidence for Purchasing/Inventory Technician Business Case

The Opportunity – Last June a business case to add a full time Pharmacy Technician for purchasing and inventory control was accepted by the VP of Finance and the VP of Patient Care, pending evidence that drug cost savings targets could be met. The data is now available to demonstrate a projected \$130,000 per year savings as a result of the efforts of the Pharmacy Purchasing and Inventory Lead Hand.

Proposal – This position is currently funded by using unspent pharmacist dollars. In order to restore this pharmacist funding, we must transfer 0.25 FTE from Purchasing to Pharmacy this fiscal year (effective November 1, 2007) and add a further 0.75 FTE for the next fiscal year (2008/09).
